A way to earn money for the parish, without cost to you!

Here's how it works. "Scrip" are preloaded gift cards from national and local retailers that the parish can buy at a discount. You buy the gift cards from Holy Cross at face value, then redeem them at your favorite stores for face value. When you do, a percentage of your purchase comes back to the parish. Scrip is on sale after Mass most weekends and at the school during weekday office hours.

Holy Cross Confirmation Program is a two-year process. Formation typically begins in the 7th Grade, but can start anytime through 10th Grade. The Confirmation Program also allows for Religious Education for all students 7-10th Grades, including preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion. 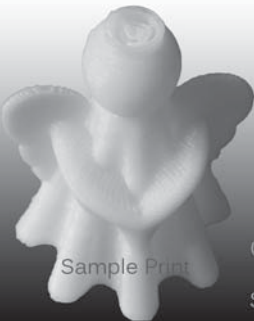

Religious Education for Children (Grades 1-6)

For families with children in Grades one through six, there are three options: (1) Children gather by grade in classes that meet every Tuesday after school hours from September through late April. Parents attend several designated class times. Classes are taught in English. (2) Children in Grades 1-6, along with one or more parents or guardians, gather on several Tuesday evenings from September through April for *Families Growing Together in Faith*. Children's classes are taught in English. Both Spanish and English are spoken for adults. In both options, children participate in learning activities, prayer services and preparation for the Sacraments of First Eucharist and First Reconciliation, under the guidance of volunteer ministers called Catechists. Parents, youth and other adults receive training and support in this ministry. Besides catechists, other volunteers are needed in support roles as childcare providers, music ministers, hall monitors and in other ways. (3) Home Study is also available. The parish provides guidance, an orientation and materials to support parents in this effort. Enrollment for all of these programs takes place during June, July & early August.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

Any adult interested in becoming Catholic is asked to participate in the RCIA. An inquirer can call the Church Office to make an appointment. Reception into the Church takes place when the person is ready. Those who are unbaptized may have a slightly longer process than those who are baptized Christians.
