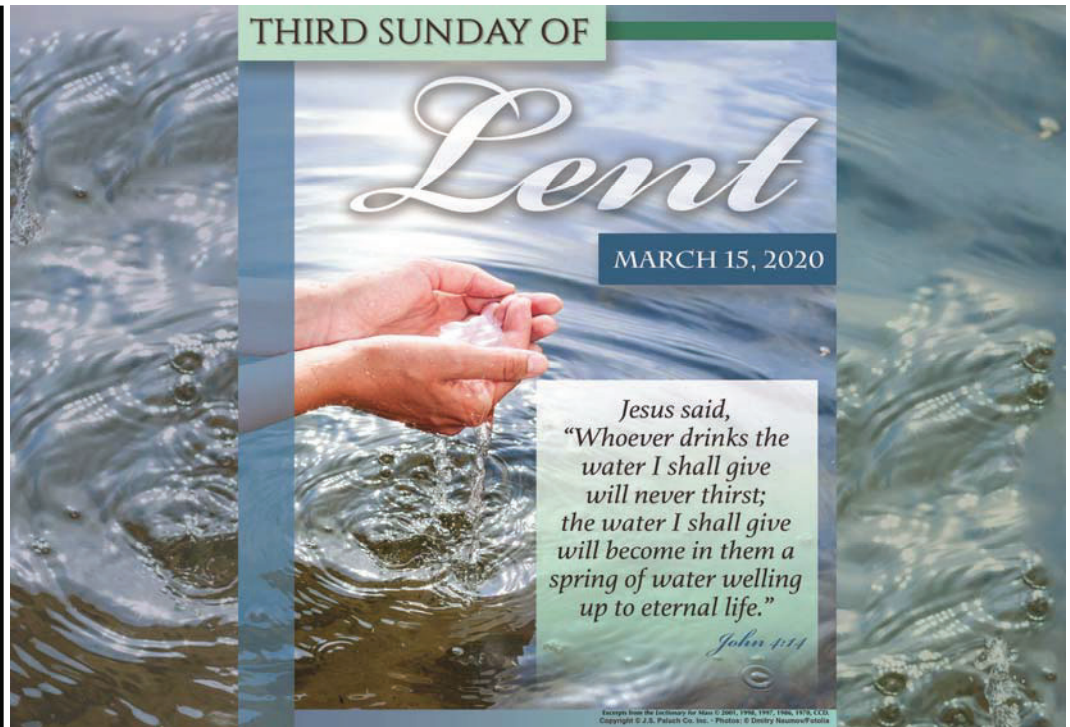

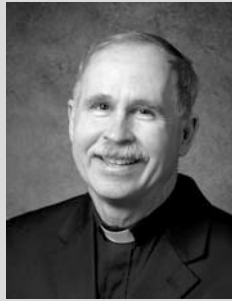

**Mandatory Precautions from the Archdiocese**

Effective **Wed. March 11, 2020**, Archbishop Naumann has directed all pastors to adopt the following changes at their parish during the celebration of the Mass:

- Drain the holy water fonts
- Suspend the exchange of the sign of peace
- Suspend the distribution of the Precious Blood during Holy Communion
- All those who serve at the altar should wash their hands thoroughly before and after Mass
- Clergy to avoid shaking hands before or after Mass
- Reinforce procedures for having extraordinary ministers sanitize their hands prior to distributing Holy Communion
- Clergy and extraordinary ministers should not touch those in the communion line who do not receive
- No hand-holding during the Lord’s Prayer
- Greeters to avoid handshakes
- In general avoid all physical contact
- Sanitize hymnals and pews on a regular basis
- Sanitize church door handles before and after Mass
- Sanitize restrooms regularly
- Provide hand sanitizer at all entrances
- Keep the gifts of bread and wine covered on the credence table in the sanctuary – no offertory gifts procession
- Ensure that all vessels used are properly sanitized per the manufacturer’s instructions after each Mass
- If possible, do the collection in a manner that limits the number of hands touching the basket
- Ask the faithful to not attend Mass if they are sick.

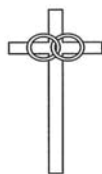
### Daughters of Isabella's Day of Reflection

- Listen to your spouse without trying to "fix the problem."

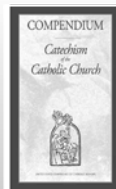
