**FROM FR. ROBERT:**

Brothers and sisters,

Today is Pentecost Sunday - it may be hard to believe, but 50 days have passed since we celebrated the Resurrection of the Lord. The coming of the Holy Spirit transformed the Apostles and the early Christian community by anointing them with graces, gifts, charisms and blessings. We pray that our parish community might be similarly anointed on this day and that the Holy Spirit might enable us to carry the Good News to the ends of the earth!

This past week the priests of the archdiocese gathered together at Benedictine College for their annual retreat. Fr. Peter John Cameron, OP, editor of *Magnificat* and Professor of Homiletics at St. Joseph's Seminary in Yonkers, New York, was the retreat master. These retreats are not completely silent; rather, the days are scheduled so as to balance spiritual conferences, personal prayer, Mass, and fraternal recreation. It is a great time for priestly renewal.

There will be a Corpus Christi Procession on June 26 at Holy Trinity Church in Lenexa. The celebration begins with Mass at 11:00, followed by one hour of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and afterwards Archbishop Naumann will lead the Eucharistic Procession through the streets near the church. Those children who made their First Communion this year are invited to participate as escorts during the procession; they are asked to wear their First Communion clothes.

My book recommendation this week is actually an instruction recently published by the Pontifical Commission *Ecclesia Dei* on April 30th of this year. The document is entitled: *Instruction on the Application of the Apostolic Letter Summorum Pontificum* of His Holiness Benedict XVI Given *Motu Proprio*. The title may be a mouthful to pronounce, but its message is very clear. This instruction is an application of the apostolic letter that Pope Benedict wrote in July 2007 about the celebration of Mass according to the Missal of 1962 – also known as the Extraordinary Form. As you may know, Pope Benedict has given general permission so that all priests may celebrate the Mass in Latin as it was done before the Second Vatican Council. I am not aware of any local churches in Johnson County that offer the Extraordinary Form of the Mass, apart from the Fraternity of St. Peter.

I realize that this permission has not been met with open arms by all bishops, priests and lay faithful, therefore, it might be helpful to consider some of the salient points found in the application (I will italicize the references from the Catholic News Service and EWTN News).

Remember, I am discussing the 1962 form of the Mass and not the new translation of the Mass that will come out at Advent:

1. *The two forms of the Roman rite are not in competition with each other, but instead, are complementary.* / This means that the Mass celebrated in the 1962 format and the Mass of Pope Paul VI from 1969 (what is normally celebrated on any given day at Holy Cross) are two legitimate ways of celebrating the Mass.

2. *The older rite, that is, the Mass in Latin from 1962, is a "precious treasure to be preserved" with "appropriate honor."* / This teaching might be hard for some to accept, especially those who did not fully understand the theology or the language of the older form of the Mass. 3. *Bishops and priests should give "a generous welcome" to any groups of Catholics who ask for the older rite to be offered.* / There have been some strong, even hostile, responses to the request for the older form of the Mass. The Holy See asks that a spirit of hospitality be extended to members of the flock who prefer the Extraordinary Form.

4. *Such groups can be of any size and can also be from one parish, various parishes or even different dioceses.* / Some dioceses tried to impose a minimum number of people required for celebrating the 1962 form of the Mass. The Holy See has rejected this attitude and called for a broad and generous application of the indult.

5. *Those preparing for the priesthood should be given training in this form of the Mass during their time in the seminary.* / This point is self-explanatory.

6. *Every priest who is not impeded by Canon Law is to be considered "qualified" for the celebration of the 1962 Mass.* / This basically means that every priest has the faculty to celebrate the Extraordinary Form of the Mass, if he so chooses.

7. *A priest need only have a "basic knowledge" of Latin so as to be able to "pronounce the words correctly and understand their meaning."* / In other words, a priest need not be a Latinist in order to celebrate the older form of the Mass. Some bishops had imposed a Latin proficiency exam on priests who wanted this faculty, but the Holy See mandates only a basic understanding and the ability to properly pronounce the words.

This document has the personal endorsement of Pope Benedict XVI, and it demonstrates his behind-the-scenes efforts to restore and preserve the Extraordinary Form of the Mass in our day.

The older form of the Mass is to be honored and venerated by the bishops, priests, religious and lay faithful, but it will not supplant the Mass of Pope Paul VI nor compete with it. I suspect that in the future, as more priests are trained in Latin and learn how to celebrate it, we will be able to find the Extraordinary Form in many parishes here in Johnson County.

Hermanos y hermanas,

Hoy es el Domingo de Pentecostés - nos parece increíble que hayan pasado 50 días desde que celebráramos la Resurrección del Señor. La venida del Espíritu Santo transformó a los Apóstoles y las primeras comunidades Cristianas al untándolos con gracias, dones y bendiciones. Oramos para que nuestra comunidad parroquial sea untada igualmente en este día y que el ¡Espíritu Santo nos permita llevar la Buena Nueva hasta el fin del mundo!

Esta pasada semana, los sacerdotes de la Arquidiócesis se reunieron en el Colegio Benedictine para celebrar su Retiro anual. Padre Peter John Cameron, OP, editor del Magnificat y Profesor de Homiletics en el Seminario Yonkers de St. Joseph, en New York, fue el maestro del Retiro. Estos Retiros no son completamente en silencio, sino que, los días están preparados con un balance entre conferencias espirituales, oración personal, Misa y recreación fraternal. Es un tiempo magnifico para renovación sacerdotal.

Habrà una procesión por Corpus Christi, el 26 de Junio, en la Iglesia Holy Trinity en Lenexa. La celebración empezará con Misa a las 11 am., seguida por una Hora de Adoración al Santísimo Sacramento. El Arzobispo Naumann dirigirá después la Procesión Eucarística a través de las calles cercanas a la iglesia. Aquellos niños que hicieron su Primera Comunión este año están invitador a participar como escoltas durante la Procesión. Se les pide que usen las vestimentas de la Primera Comunión.

Mi recomendación de libro para esta semana es actualmente una instrucción publicada recientemente por la Comisión Pontifical Ecclesia Dei, el 30 de Agosto de este año. Este documento se titula: Instrucción sobre la Aplicación de la Carta Apostólica *Summorum Pontificum*, dl Padre Santo Benedicto XVI Dado *Motum Proprio*. El título es difícil de pronunciar pero su mensaje es muy claro. Esta instrucción es una aplicación de la carta apostólica que el Papa Benedicto escribió en Julio 2007, sobre la celebración de la Misa de acuerdo al Misal de 1962 - conocida también como la Forma Extraordinaria. Como saben todos, el Papa Benedicto ha dado permiso general a todos los sacerdotes para celebrar Misa en Latín, como era celebrada antes del Segundo Council Vaticano. No sé de ninguna iglesia en Johnson County que ofrece la Forma Extraordinaria de la Misa, aparte de la Fraternidad de San Pedro.

Me doy cuenta que este permiso con brazos abiertos por todos los Obispos, sacerdotes y laicos, así es que, pudiera ayudarnos el considerar algunos de los puntos salientes dentro de la aplicación. Recuerden que me refiero a la forma de la Misa en 1962 y no la nueva traducción de la Misa que vendrá en el Adviento:

1. *Las dos formas del Rito Romano no están en competencia entre ellos, sino que, se complementan.* Esto quiere decir que la Misa celebrada en el formato del 1962 y la Misa del Papa Pablo VI en el 1969 (la que normalmente celebramos en Holy Cross) son dos formas legítimas de celebrar la Misa.
2. *El rito más viejo, o sea, la Misa en Latín del 1962, es un “precioso tesoro para ser preservado” con “apropiado honor”.* Esta enseñanza puede ser dura de aceptar para algunas personas, especialmente aquéllos que no entendieron completamente la teología o el lenguaje de la forma antigua de la Misa.
3. *Obispos y sacerdotes deberán darle una bienvenida generosa a cualquier grupo de Católicos que pidan que el rito antiguo sea ofrecido.* Ha habido algunos resposnos fuertes y hostiles sobre la petición de la forma antigua de la Misa. La Santa Sed pide que el espíritu de hospitalidad sea extendido a los miembros de los grupos que prefieren la Forma Extraordinaria.
4. *Estos grupos pueden ser de cualquier tamaño y de distintas parroquias o diócesis.* Algunas diócesis trataron de imponer un número mínimo de personas requeridos

para celebrar la forma de Misa del 1962. La Santa Sed ha rechazado esta actitud y llamaron por un amplio y generosa aplicación del indulto.

5. *Esos preparándose para el sacerdocio deberán recibir entrenamiento en esta forma de Misa durante su tiempo en el Seminario.*
6. *Cada sacerdote que no es impedido por la Ley de Canon estará considerado "competente" para la celebración de la Misa del 1962.* Esto significa básicamente que todos los sacerdotes tienen la facultad de celebrar la Forma de Misa Extraordinaria, si ellos lo quieren.
7. *Los sacerdotes solo tienen que tener un "conocimiento básico" del Latín para poder "pronunciar las palabras correctamente y comprender el significado de ellas".* En otras palabras, un sacerdote no tiene que ser Latinista para poder celebrar la forma antigua de la Misa. Algunos obispos han impuesto un exámen de habilidad del Latín a sacerdotes que quieran esta facultad, pero la Santa Sed ha mandado solamente un entendimiento básico y la habilidad de pronunciar las palabras.

Este documento tiene el endorso personal del Papa Benedicto XVI y demuestra su esfuerzo-detrás-de-la-esena para restaurar y preservar la Forma Extraordinaria de la Misa en nuestros días.

La forma antigua de la Misa será venerada y honrada por los obispos, sacerdotes, religiosos y laicos, pero no suplantará la Misa del Papa Pablo VI, o competirá con ella tampoco. Me imagino que en el futuro, al entrenar más sacerdotes en el Latín y aprender como celebrar esta Forma, podremos encontrar la Forma Extraordinaria en muchas parroquia de Johnson County.
