FROM FR. ROBERT:

Brothers and Sisters,

O Sacrament Most Holy, O Sacrament Divine,
All Praise And All Thanksgiving Be Every Moment
Thine.

This is a special time of the year when we commemorate a series of beautiful feasts on the Sundays following Pentecost. Today, the second Sunday after Pentecost, we are celebrating the Solemnity of Corpus Christi – The Most Holy Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ. I mentioned in this column a few weeks ago that the Archdiocese will host a special program today at Holy Trinity Church in Lenexa. The festivities begin with Mass at 11:00, followed by one hour of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and afterwards Archbishop Naumann will lead a Eucharistic Procession through the streets near the church. Those children who made their First Communion this year are invited to participate as escorts during the procession; they are asked to wear their First Communion clothes.

Holy Cross has been blessed with a chapel of perpetual adoration for quite a number of years now. This small refuge of peace and tranquility acts as a tremendous channel of grace for all the activities of the parish. I want to thank all the faithful men, women, and children who come each week to adore Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Over the course of the past year you might have noticed petitions asking for more people to cover hours that are empty during the week. Because of difficulty in finding help to fill all the hours, and not wanting to continue the unfortunate custom of covering the monstrance with a veil during the empty hours (something that should not be done), I have suggested to Fr. Mike Stubbs, the new pastor, that we cut back on the hours of adoration in the chapel. On this Solemnity of Corpus Christi, I ask all of you to pray that more generous souls will come forward to cover the empty hours so that we do not have to cut back on the adoration schedule.

Fr. Marc Tillia preached at all the Masses last weekend and special missionary envelopes were given out. The money collected from our parish community will be used to help the pastoral work done in the mission where he works in Bahia, Brazil. His parish covers a large area that includes around 50 villages. We will continue to collect these envelopes for several weeks before sending him the final amount. So, it is not too late to help!!

We are living in a Scripturally rich period in the Church. In the past few years there have been some very good books published on the Bible that provide a great resource for personal and group study. This week I would like to recommend the Navarre Bible – New Testament – for your reading. You might be thinking "great, just what I need, yet another Bible!" However,

reading the Navarre Bible is like attending a Scripture class at one of the best (ie, faithful) Catholic universities in the world. One does not have to travel very far to witness how other Christian denominations have worked extra hard to provide Scriptural resources for their faithful - why not Catholics???

The Navarre Bible is an unabashedly Catholic look at the books of the New Testament. It was originally published in Spain under the aegis of the University of Navarre in Pamplona. St. Josemaria Escrivá, the founder of Opus Dei, in the 1960's asked the Scripture faculty for a faithful translation of the Bible and a commentary to accompany it. In 1985 this impressive work was translated into English – the Old Testament was published in seven volumes and the New Testament was done in twelve. In 2008 the New Testament was condensed into a handy one volume edition.

Each book begins with a well-researched introduction that follows a standard outline of structure and content, context, and message. Each page gives the English RSVCE (Revised Standard Version Catholic Edition – instead of the Navarre version. The editors apparently felt that the RSVCE was close enough to the original texts.) translation on top, parallel texts on the sides, the Latin Vulgate in small letters across the middle, and commentary on the lower half of the page. I personally like the many references to the Fathers of the Church – for example, under 1Corinthians 10:16-17 (the second reading of today) it says this:

The main effect of the Eucharist is intimate union with Christ. The Fathers of the Church have always emphasized this: "What in fact is the bread? The body of Christ. What do they become who receive Communion? The body of Christ" (St. John Chrysostom).

The Navarre Bible, New Testament, p.638

This book is for the Catholic who wants to know more about the Bible, but might not have time to look up different resources or attend a weekly Scripture study. This is a "one-stop shopping experience"...a "spiritual Wal-Mart", if you will.

Hermanos y hermanas,

Oh, Santísimo Sacramento, Oh, Divino Sacramento, todo Honor y toda Gloria sea suya siempre.

Este tiempo especial del año conmemora y celebramos una serie de fiestas muy bonitas, después de Pentecostés. Hoy, celebramos la solemnidad de Corpus Cristi, el Santo Cuerpo y Sangre de nuestro Señor Jesucristo. Hacemos varias semanas mencioné el programa especial que se celebra hoy en la iglesia de Holy Trinity, en Lenexa, presentado por la Arquidiócesis, incluyendo una procesión dirigida por el Arzobispo Naumann.

Holy Cross ha sido bendecido por varios años, con una capilla de perpetua adoración. Quiero agradecer a todos nuestros fieles hombres y mujeres que visitan esta capilla todas las semanas, para adorar a Nuestro Señor en el Santísimo Sacramento. Habrán visto peticiones pidiendo más personas para cubrir las horas que no están tomadas en la semana. Ya que se hace difícil cubrir todas las horas de la semana y no queriendo continuar con la costumbre de tapar el Santísimo con un velo durante las horas vacías, he sugerido al Padre Mike Stubbs, el nuevo pastor, el cortar las horas de adoración en la capilla. En este solemne día del Corpus Cristi, les pido a todos que oren para que almas generosas respondan a este llamado de cubrir las horas vacías para no tener que cortar las horas de adoración.

El Padre Marc Tillia predicó en todas las misas del domingo pasado y sobres especiales de misioneros fueron pasados a todos los presentes. El dinero recogido en estos sobres especiales de nuestra comunidad parroquial será utilizado para ayudar el trabajo pastoral en las misiones de Bahía, Brazil, donde él trabaja. Esa parroquia cubre alrededor de 50 pueblos. Recogeremos estos sobres por varias semanas antes de mandarle el cheque final. ¡Así es que, no es muy tarde para ayudarlo!

Estamos viviendo en un período rico en Escrituras en la Iglesia. En años pasados, ha habido algunos libros muy buenos publicados sobre la Biblia, conteniendo buenos recursos para estudio personal o de grupos. Esta semana me gustaría recomendarles la Biblia de Navarro-Nuevo Testamento. Les diré que leer esta Biblia es como asistir una clase sobre las Escrituras en las mejores universidades Católicas del mundo.

La Biblia de Navarro es una clara versión Católica de los libros del Nuevo Testamento. Fue publicada originalmente en España, bajo la protección de la Universidad de Navarra, en Pamplona. San Josémaría Escrivá, el fundador del Opus Dei, en los 1960's, pidió a la facultad de esta universidad, una fiel traducción de la Biblia y un comentario acompañándola. En 1985, este impresionante trabajo fue traducido al Inglés – el Viejo Testamento dentro de siete volúmenes y el Nuevo Testamento en doce. En 2008, el Nuevo Testamento fue condensado dentro de una conveniente edición de un solo volumen. Cada libro empieza con una bien estudiada introducción, seguido de un bosquejo normal de estructura, contenido, contexto y mensaje. Cada página da la Versión Normal Católica Revisada (RSVCE), en vez de la versión Navarra. Por ejemplo, 1 Corintios 10:16-17, (la segunda lectura de hoy) dice: *El efecto principal de la Eucaristía es la unión íntima con Cristo. Los Padres de la Iglesia han enfatizado siempre esto: “¿Qué es de hecho el pan? El Cuerpo de Cristo. ¿Qué se hacen los que reciben la Comunión? El Cuerpo de Cristo.”* (San Juan Crisostom). *La Biblia Navarra, New Testamento, p.638.*

Este libro es para los Católicos que quieren saber más sobre la Biblia, pero no tienen el tiempo de buscar los diferentes recursos o asistir a un estudio de Biblia semanal. Esto es como una “visita espiritual a Walmart”.....
